They are working in partnership with local not-for-profit company Wessex Resolutions C.I.C. who are delivering fixed rate loans for home improvements on their behalf.

The average lifespan of a boiler is 10-15 years and the Energy Saving Trust estimates that if you replace an old G-rated boiler with a modern A-rated boiler with a full set of heating controls, you could save around £340 a year on your gas bill.

Loan funds are recycled for the benefit of the community. Each time a repayment is made the money goes back into the original lending pot and is then available to help more people in need. Spreading the cost of a replacement boiler can be a real benefit to people who can't afford the unexpected cost upfront, but need to have a working boiler right away. ### BUTTERCROSS HEALTH CENTRE IS OFFERING A NEW SERVICE.

As part of Symphony Healthcare Services, Buttercross surgery has been one of the first GP practices in south Somerset to offer the services of musculoskeletal practitioners (MSK) to support existing GPs.

Musculoskeletal practitioners are physiotherapists who have additional experience and training in the management of a variety of soft tissue, joint and nerve related problems. They also work closely with orthopaedic consultants. These links are hugely beneficial in ensuring best practice.

The service offered at Buttercross, is an assessment service to advise on the management of musculoskeletal conditions, without needing to see, or be referred by your GP first. If appropriate, the practitioners can organise further actions such as X-rays, scans, injections and courses of rehabilitation through referral to local physiotherapy departments.

If you feel you have a musculoskeletal problem, please discuss this with the Buttercross reception staff when booking your appointment and where possible they will book you in to see someone from the MSK team. Don't forget, you will be able to see them as a first contact without needing to book an initial appointment with your GP.

Residents are being warned to be wary of Council Tax scams that may be prevalent in the next few weeks as bills start to be delivered to households.

The offer to reduce your Council Tax banding, reduce your monthly payments or claim money back for a small fee may sound enticing, but it's more than likely that you have been contacted by a scammer who is only interested in getting money or your bank details out of you.

One scam currently in operation that has been highlighted to South Somerset District Council asks for you to confirm your bank details in an email to receive a refund for your previous years Council Tax bill. The email even gives a telephone number to call which is a direct line to the Council Tax Team at Oldham Council, making it appear even more genuine.

There are key things to check when you receive communication about Council Tax. The following might help you to identify whether you are being scammed:

When writing to you, South Somerset District Council will address the letter directly to you rather than to 'the occupier' or 'sir/madam';

We will never ask for your bank account details on the phone or via email, to refund overpaid council tax.

Many scams involve asking for a fee to see if your Council Tax banding can be lowered. This is a service that can be done for free. Council Tax bands are set by the Valuation Office Agency and can only be changed under certain conditions. Details can be found at www.gov.uk/council-tax-appeals.

If you are unsure of who you are talking to and instinct tells you something is not quite right, hang up, call 01935 462462 and check with a customer advisor whether the name of the person who called you really does exist.

If you have given over personal details, we would advise you to call the Police straight away on 101 and report the matter as an identity theft scam. The Police will also direct you to the Action Fraud helpline on 0300 123 2040.

If you are not on the Electoral Roll you have to register by Thursday 13 April. The easiest and quickest way is for you to register online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote. With our increasingly busy lives more us are signing up to vote by post - 1 in 5 of us in the Somerton Division now choose to use our Postal Vote. It is a safe, easy, and secure way of ensuring your vote always counts and that your voice is always heard.

In the Somerton Division there are 7,448 (50% in Somerton itself) of us registered to vote of which 1,440 (approx. 1 in 5) of us have elected for a postal vote. If you want to add your name to this register then the deadline is Tuesday 18 April 2017. Your Postal Vote will arrive on your doorstep on or about Friday 21 April to be returned to SSDC's Brympton Way Offices by close of the poll on Thursday 4 May but can also be handed in to your Polling Station on the same day.

If you are lucky enough to be sunning yourself on the Riviera you have until Tuesday 25 April to apply for a Proxy Vote, i.e. someone else voting at the Polling Station on your behalf. If your appointed proxy wishes to vote by post then they have until Tuesday 18th April to apply.
