- The Remembrance Service held on Sunday 13th November 2016 was attended by a number of councillors and a wreath was laid on behalf of Somerton Town Council
- Ricksey Lane has now been resurfaced.
- Ben Middleditch Somerton's PCSO has been appointed to Crewkerne and his replacement is Fiona Wilson. We wish both Ben and Fiona well in their new posts.
- There is an open day at the fire station, Somerton on 10th December 10 am - 2 pm
- The order for the new temporary changing room at the Recreation Ground has been placed with an installation date of January 2017
- The new Town Map is progressing and the order has been placed
- The Oak Tree Planting Scheme is progressing with a scheduled planting date towards the end of November working in partnership working SSDC.
- A grant for £2700 has been provisionally agreed with the Wessex Rooms Trust to support running the Junior Youth Club. This funding will cover the rent for the building.
- Somerton Town Council agreed not to provide funding towards a feasibility study for a new station near Somerton until further information is received.

- It is anticipated that the two vacant Councillor positions will be filled by co-option at the January 2017 Full Council meeting.
- STC will support A Nations tribute, on 11th November 2018 commemorating the end of the First World War. Further information will be published in due course.
- STC are busy working on the budget for 2017/18 which will be formally approved at the January Full Council meeting
