#### **SOMERTON REMEMBERS - SILENT SOLDIERS 1918 - 2018**

Thank you to everyone who came to the Museum in the Pinney Room on Festival Market Day. We spoke to over 50 people and we hope some will contact us again about their World War I fathers and grandfathers, especially the ones who survived.

In August David & Joan Perkins told me about their grandparents in the Great War. Joan's grandfather, William Wood, had joined the Territorials and in October 1914 he sailed to India with the Middlesex Regiment. He was a drummer in the band and spent much of the war on ceremonial parades. He had a variety of jobs after the war and was an air raid

warden in the Second World War. Joan's grandmother, Hettie, married William Wood in 1901 and they lived in a flat in Kensington. When he went to India in 1914 she worked in a munitions factory somewhere in the Shepherd's Bush area of London. She had four children by then, so Joan's mother, aged 12, took over the running of the family. Hettie joined the St John's Ambulance Brigade after the war and attended many events at the White City stadium etc.

Joan's other grandfather was Sydney Penny, RN, from Marlborough. He joined the Navy in 1906 and served on HMS Victory as a domestic steward. Later he served on destroyers at Scapa Flow, buying fresh food for the officers from the neighbouring islands and cooking it for them on board. The destroyers worked as screen vessels for the Dreadnoughts and Sydney Penny was present at some of the great naval battles of the war, but not usually very close to the action. He stayed on in the Navy until 1929, and then returned to Marlborough to help in family shops and he ran a large garden. He served again in WW2 on troop landing ships training for D-Day. He left the Navy in late 1944 and worked at the Marlborough Tile Company until it closed and then as a cleaner at Marlborough College until he was well over 80.


