Russet Road (Bovis development)

- STC have agreed a response to County Highways Officer.
- STC acknowledge the problems the road layout and varied potential solutions cause some of the residents in Russet Road, Bancombe Road, Parklands and surrounding areas.
- STC have attempted to facilitate a solution to meet the needs of the residents but are conscious that it is County Highways that have the responsibility to manage this issue.

The preferred solutions are:

Phase One: Block Russet Road at the junction with Bancombe Road with signage. Phase Two: Reopen Bancombe Road at the junction with Langport Road before any further development takes place in Somerton.

Funding for the works to be potentially allocated from the Fairfax development.

Somerton Recreation Ground Trust AGM

A well-attended meeting was held at Edgar Hall in November with positive feedback from the management committee and user groups. It was formally agreed to set up a new Trust structure effective from 1st April 2019.

Other Items

- £9.8 million assigned to Highways Improvements from central government which is a positive to Highways improvements. Further to this £5 million towards adult care there is hope it may include or be assigned to children's' care, but this still needs to be confirmed.
- Grit bin funding is in place.
- School funding is now approved.

- Thanks, given to Councillor Jo Gale for all her efforts regarding the Remembrance Service and indeed the 100-year commemorative service held Sunday 11th November for the end of the 1st World War.
- Somerton Residents praised for their support to the Remembrance Service held on Sunday. Fantastic turn out and something to be proud of by all those in attendance.

Grants have been approved for the following:

- Somerton Recreation Ground Trust, disabled access.
- Somerton Recreation Ground Trust: Sub metering at the Sports Club for electric and gas works.
- The police hosted a Crime Prevention Meeting at Edgar Hall and are working with business owners on the trading estate to improve security.
- Temporary road closure Pesters Lane, Somerton 3rd December for 3 days.
- Members of the Town Council met with 40 A level students from Millfield who were researching changes to Somerton and surrounding communities as part of the Geography syllabus.
- Dog watch is now operational.
- Judging of the domestic Christmas Lights will take place w/c 17th December 2018. Prize of £50 and a trophy to be presented at January Full Council
- Etsome Terrace Play Area will be closed in twilight hours for the winter months and this will be reviewed in the spring.
- A vintage market will be held on the third Friday of each month in the area around the Buttercross, this is in adddition to the general market held on the first Friday of each month.
- STC are working with the new Library Trust group and Somerset County Council to secure an ongoing library service in Somerton. It is envisaged that the new way of working will be in place by 1st April 2019.
- STC will approve its annual budget at the Full Council meeting on 8th January 2019.




