

#### **SAMARITANS ARE HERE FOR YOU:**

Don't let things stew, get together for a brew. There is no escaping the fact that January is a tough month. In fact, the third Monday of January is now widely tagged by the media as the most depressing day of the year and one which lawyers often refer to as divorce day. That's why Samaritans have created the concept of Brew Monday - a campaign which is dedicated to preventing suicide and improving the nation's mental health.

Brew Monday is a day when everyone can beat the blues and connect with each other over a brew, and perhaps a biscuit (or two). After all, who doesn't love a cup of tea (or coffee, or hot chocolate?) It's important to talk about mental health, and one of the best ways to get someone to open up, is over the kitchen table and a steaming hot cup of tea. Brew Monday will give you a chance to talk to family and friends, or simply just listen. An initial chat may spark a longer, ongoing conversation which could even help to save a life.

Though the trend of death by suicide is falling, the South West still has one of the highest incidences of suicide in the UK. Clearly, there is still much work to be done. #Brew Monday, which in 2019 falls on January 21st, is just one of the ways that you can get involved. If you want to turn #Brew Monday into a fund-raising event to raise vital funds for Samaritans to ensure we can always be there for those who have nowhere else to turn, you can send off for a fund-raising pack which is available via the website at www.samaritans.org.


