

FLY TIPPING IS SPOILING OUR COUNTRYSIDE

STC is becoming increasingly concerned about fly-tipping locally as the problem is escalating. Recent incidents saw waste dumped in a country road between Highbrooks Road and Mill Lane with bags of rubbish thrown down on the grass verge and gateway.

It is easy for residents to protect themselves against fly-tippers: never pay cash for waste to be removed, get a receipt and keep notes of people, contact details and vehicles, and check that tradespeople: builders, gardeners, carpet layers – have a waste carrier licence and can explain where the waste will go. If you see fly-tippers/tipping, stay safe, take notes and report it to SSDC https://legacy.southsomerset.gov.uk/indigo.aspx?caseserviceid=453143.




