

'SAFE PLACES' SCHEME BEGINS IN SOMERTON

Somerton now has a 'Safe Place' for vulnerable people who feel frightened or at risk. Somerton's 'Safe Place', at Wessex House nursing home, was formally begun by the Somerton Area Dementia Action Alliance (SADAA). Since its launch in May last year SADAA's membership has grown to 75, with 347 'Dementia Friends'; and the 'Safe Places' scheme is the next step in the process. The event at Edgar Hall also included three Dementia Friends Sessions to recruit new 'Dementia Friends', so that SADAA can reach its target of 500 in the Somerton area.

Shirley Chapman, Dementia Friends Champion and Vice Chair of SADAA, said, "Following a recent incident in Somerton we really needed a 'Safe Places' scheme here, and we are delighted that so many people came to the event to learn more about SADAA and Somerton's new 'Safe Place'."




