On 9th October the Charity Commission registered Somerton's new CIO Trust with the number 1185712. The KSF Community Trust will now follow the rules and regulations of the Charity Commission which are there to protect the Community Trust itself, the Trustees and the people of Somerton who benefit from the 'park'. Now this Trust can open a Charity Bank Account and serious fund raising to purchase the field can begin. At a meeting with a representative of Somerset County Council it was agreed that the KSFC Trust can buy the field from the County Council for £750,000 without any competition and the Trust has a year to raise the funds. A tall order maybe but with your help and support the trustees are confident of success. 
