

#### MESSAGE FROM PAT FLAHERTY, CHIEF EXECUTIVE SCC

World Health Organisation reminds us today that the pandemic is not over, and in its most dangerous phase on the global stage. In Somerset, it is still a live event and we need to continue to think of it that way into the autumn and winter. The message is to keep safe, social distance and remember the virus hasn't gone away.

Somerset is still in a good place – we've had 1,281 confirmed cases but sadly 199 people have died. There was a small outbreak in Burnham on Sea from a public house.

However all customers have been contacted by using Track and Trace supported by our outbreak plan.

#### SOMERTON LIFELINE

We have been running now from 18th March and it is almost a way of life! Prescriptions are still busy but we are now only going to pick up on Mon, Weds and Fridays. The demand for shopping has reduced, but we think the food bank is going to get busy. It is now operating from Edgar Hall but only for phoning and then delivery (see article below). Many of the original 105 volunteers are now back at work and we thank them for their support.

We have been offered the chance for some of our volunteers to do the MIND Level 1 "First Aid in Mental Health Awareness" course which results in a certificate and knowledge to help those in difficult situations know where to go for help.

The regular phone numbers will accept calls requesting such help, as well as food and prescriptions.

#### SOMERTON COMMUNITY FOODBANK

A huge thank you to everyone who has donated towards the Community Foodbank, we have delivered around 12 boxes a week to provide help to members of our community during the pandemic. The Etsome Arms have kindly given their space and time to help run operations, but it is now up and running again as a pub, therefore we have moved the Foodbank to the Edgar Hall.

The Co-op in Somerton has kindly placed collection boxes inside for donations. We are operating on a Monday on a delivery only basis. If you need a food box, please contact the NEW number: 07561 651 372.

#### **SPEEDWATCH – WE ARE BACK**

SpeedWatch is out and about again after getting the clearance from the police. We have already been out and unfortunately had to send in reports of cars travelling at over 35 mph in our 20 zones. We are also reporting drivers who exceed the limit on any of our roads and when it says 20mph it means exactly that. If you exceed the speed limits you will be reported and if you are perpetual speeder it is recorded and you will be flagged up and can expect more than a reminder through the post.

We find that only a few drivers are abusive and object to us being out but the majority of people support what we do and are pleased we are back, even if it is just to remind them to slow down. We are supported by the police and any abuse or intimidation is and will continue to be dealt with through official channels – fortunately this is a rare occurrence. #### PARISH ROOMS RE-OPENING

#### RUBBISH

As Gregory & Rachel Mason noted in the last issue of Viaduct, now that lockdown is easing and fast food outlets are re-opening, the incidence of litter in our hedgerows and verges has once again increased. Also, some people have noted discarded face coverings and with the new ruling that they must be worn in shops, please be reminded not to discard them, nor any plastic gloves, but take them home and, if you can, wash and reuse them, but if not then discard safely.

#### SOMERTON LIBRARY

Somerset County Council (SCC) has introduced a phased approach to opening libraries in Somerset, with the initial focus on the five larger libraries: Bridgwater, Frome, Minehead, Taunton and Yeovil. Smaller SCC-managed libraries will open after the 'big 5' when the necessary safety measures have been reviewed and are in place. Community Library Partnerships, such as Somerton, will be supported by SCC and will follow similar procedures, but there is an overriding requirement to ensure the safety of Somerton's band of volunteers, some of whom may be in the vulnerable categories defined by the government.

Somerton Library will not reopen until issues and lessons have been identified following the operation of the 'big 5' and smaller SCC-managed libraries such as Langport. Time will be required to determine how these issues can be dealt with in a volunteer dependent library. It is therefore unlikely that Somerton Library will open before mid-September.

Initially, browsing books in libraries will not be possible because of concerns about handling books.

The core provision will be an 'order and collect' service so that customers can place an order for a selection of books, talking books or DVDs that staff will hand-pick to be collected from the library. They may be collected by a third party on behalf of the customer. It is expected that Somerton Library will offer limited access to the public computers. At first this is likely to be for pre-booked, time limited slots. Library opening hours may have to be adjusted to accommodate a range of constraints and priorities. When the details of the 'new operating model' for Somerton Library are better defined, the information will be advertised locally. Jeremy Greenop
