If you wish to attend the Zoom meeting and to ask questions, please contact the Town Clerk. Planning applications may be viewed on the SSDC website with application details displayed on the notice board outside the Parish Rooms and on the STC website.

All agendas and minutes are available on the STC website www.somertontowncouncil.gov.uk Requests from the public for items to be added to the agenda should be notified to the Town Clerk in writing by the first Monday of the month.

- There will be an emergency Access and Highways meeting (date to be arranged) details will be on the STC website
- Grants have been approved for the following: Archies Extra £1500
- Two electronic noticeboards have been installed in the town. These will be used to
  encourage community engagement, creating an information hub providing access to up to
  date services, activities, events and developments in Somerton.
- STC have endorsed the IDDEA Renewable Energy Systems Solar Panel Initiative. Residents may well have already received flyers setting out the initiative and how to sign up.
- The Council's Working Party on Social Media presented their initial report to the November meeting. STC approved all but one recommendation. The report can be found on the STC website.
- STC's Tree Strategy seeks to address the shortfall in tree canopy cover in Somerton's
  urbanised land area, which currently stands at 10%. To meet future demands, ideally, this
  should be increased to 30% by 2050. The Council would like to hear from Somerton residents
  who have current tree planting plans and those who would like to increase tree cover on
  their land. There are opportunities for STC to bid for trees from organisations including the
  District Council and the Woodland Trust. Please contact Cllr Pither or Cllr Taylor (tree
  wardens) to discuss further.
- Sadly there has been an increase in fly tipping in and around our Town. Please be aware there is a fine for fly tipping. All waste and recycling should be taken to the recycling centre or (if they are closed for any reason) stored in a safe place until it can be dealt with.
- Removable bollards have now been fitted at Russet Road.
- The STC office will be closed from 1pm on the 24th December until Monday 4th January 2021.
- After what has been such a challenging year for everyone, the Town Council would like to send season's greetings to all residents of Somerton.

### MESSAGES FROM YOUR LOCAL PATIENTS' PARTICIPATION GROUP

DID YOU KNOW that Buttercross Health Centre usually handles between seven and eight thousand telephone calls per month? For example, during September staff answered 7696 calls – equivalent to approximately 350 each working day. Every day is busy but Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday are especially so and mornings tend to be much busier than afternoons.

### Viaduct No. 206 - December 2020

Staff deal with every call as efficiently and swiftly as possible and, although it is a much over-used phrase these days, it is absolutely true that every call is important. Some callers need more time to describe their issue, perhaps because they are distressed or confused, so being kept waiting in a queue is often unavoidable, especially during peak times. However, if your call can wait until staff are less busy then the response time is likely to be much quicker.

This season, early demand for flu vaccine has been higher than usual due to concerns about the coronavirus pandemic. Already, far more people than usual at this stage in the flu campaign have been vaccinated. But please do not worry if you are asked to wait a few weeks for yours until further deliveries arrive. Re-ordering is necessary as flu vaccine in bulk quantities cannot be stored for future use and the type of vaccine you receive will be tailored to your age group.

By the end of December there will be two vacancies on the Buttercross/Ilchester Patients' Participation Group. There is a particular need to recruit younger members (age 20-45) and/or those with a young family. This will enable the PPG membership to better represent the community as a whole. The PPG meets (currently virtually) eight times a year. During meetings – which start at 6:30pm and last no longer than 75 minutes – concerns, suggestions and ways to develop healthcare provision locally are discussed. At most meetings, a presentation (with time for questions) is given by a clinician or one of the support staff to enable members to better understand the practice's healthcare provision. ### SOMERTON DEVELOPMENT SHORTLISTED FOR AWARD

Exmoor-based bespoke metalwork specialists West Country Blacksmiths have had a project at the Courthouse Mews development in Somerton shortlisted for the 2020 GAGA Construction Awards which celebrate the design and construction of bespoke metalwork both nationally and internationally. The bespoke designed metalwork was produced as part of the development of the former Courthouse and Market Place buildings, which have been tastefully converted and extended to provide eight apartments and a two-bedroom house in the heart of Somerton. The metalwork designed and made to complete this development includes a fully automated gate with decorative archway, over 53 metres of wall-top railings, six Juliette balconies, handrails, balcony railings and a bench.

The concept for the metalwork was the brainchild of Frank Martin (Trustee and founder of ACE arts), who said, "Finding creative partners who are able to deliver on my personal inspiration is a rare talent, which West Country Blacksmiths have. As Creative Director my design brief was inspired by through mirror images, and it has become a reality in a medium I am not usually associated with. Everyone at Courthouse Mews is delighted with West Country Blacksmiths' work, a unique and stunning finish to the development that has helped to Somerton become "one of the most creative, contemporary and forward-thinking towns in Somerset."

# To date we have raised well over £100K with more than £1000 raised from the Event in September!

The option to sell part of the field to the Trust has been confirmed by SCC if the full target of £750K is not achieved.

### SOMERTON MUSIC AND ARTS FESTIVAL

Somerton Music and Arts Festival has been entertaining the people of Somerton and helping to bring newcomers to the town for over 30 years. Starting life as Somerton Summer Arts Festival, every July we put on a 10 day event of music, arts, education and entertainment to suit all ages, tastes and interests. Most recently we have incorporated the word Music into our title, registered as a Community Interest Company and introduced a one day Music Festival 'Somerstock' into the line-up. We aim to have a good mix of local artists and entertainers as well as bringing acts to Somerton that we may otherwise have to travel to see.

With all this going on, it is not surprising that some people may think that we must be a commercial business staffed by paid employees. This is far from the case and every now and then we need to make a clarification.

Therefore, we would like to put on public record that we are run by unpaid volunteers who devote a significant portion of their life to keeping the festival going; purely out of their love of arts, music and the community. The CIC annual accounts are freely available and our financial objective is to have enough funds in the bank at the end of the year to ensure we can sustain the following year. Any surplus is generally re-invested to make the festival even better and donations are made to local organisations or charities. In addition, we donate surplus from the Somerstock event specifically to named local charities and the community. In 2019 we gave over £1000 for St Margaret's Hospice who also raised a similar amount on the day.

We continue to value the support of our community and if anyone feels they have any skills and experience to offer us or just share our passion for arts, music and/or the community then you would be most welcome to join us. This could be on our committee, as a steward in town or Somerstock or just helping out throughout the year with ideas and practical support.

Whilst we are living in difficult times, we are optimistic that a sufficient degree of normality will resume next year to allow our events to take place safely, even if we need to make some changes including, potentially, restructuring the event to meet the numbers able to attend. As such, tickets for Somerstock 2021 are back on sale and will stay at the early bird rate until the end of January 2021 and we strongly encourage purchase now to avoid disappointment and to help us plan a great event! With our headline act, The Christians and many other fantastic bands (including many popular local acts), top class food, drinks, and fun for all the family we look forward to seeing you all next year. In the meantime, we appreciate your support with special thanks to our ticket holders, sponsors and advertisers.

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
