SCOP26+ Climate Conference

Somerset held its own COP26 event on Saturday 6 November hosted by The Levels Climate Forum, with STC as a delivery partner. The event, held at the Edgar Hall, attracted councillors, community volunteers and climate activists from across Somerset.

With the Somerset Levels on the front line of climate change, the invited speakers spoke passionately about the threats we face and the need to adapt our buildings, our communities and ourselves.

The conference heard presentations from Will Barnard, from the Farming and Wildlife Advisory Group South West (FWAG), on land management and encourging farmers to collaborate in 'moor associations' to present a collective voice to decison-makers. Rupert Farthing from Carymoor Environmental Trust, on inspiring communities, children and young people to engage with our living environment through workshops that deliver measurable change. Melissa Taylor from Glastonbury Town Council on climate anxiety and building emotional resilience in the face of epic planetary change. Bruton Town Council's retrofit officer Justine Mallinson on the need for 20,000 'retrofit assessors', currently only 1,000 exist to date. Bruton TC is the first parish in the country to employ a retrofit officer. Jon Cousins, Mayor of Glastonbury, closing the conference with a call to everyone present to return to their parishes and organise a citizen assembly on climate change to bring their communities up to speed on what we face and how we can all help prepare for what's coming.

Midway through the conference, everyone met in smaller groups to discuss the benefits of councils putting in place a Green Charter that sets out how that council will care for its environment in all it does directly and indirectly, and to influence others to do the same.

Everyone agreed that by bringing together the parishes and towns of Somerset to listen, discuss and share ideas and best practice, we can make a real difference. With over 9,000 parish and town councils in England, serving over 16 million people, we can hold the Government to account and be a real force for change. The conference talks will be posted up shortly on the Climate Levels Forum YouTube Channel for anyone who wants to learn more. The next Levels Climate Forum will be held via Zoom on

Getting on board with the buses

The future is suddenly starting to look a lot brighter for bus services in Somerset. Over the past decade, public transport has not been an economic or developmental priority for Somerset County Council. Bus journeys in the County have fallen by 43% over the past decade, we have the second lowest bus journeys per head in the country and our bus services have the lowest satisfaction score.



But the Government's Bus Back Better strategy has prompted a major rethink with £3 billion of funding for bus improvements to be shared out between transport authorities across England (outside of London). Somerset County Council has responded and developed a highly ambitious Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP) and is asking the Government to fund the Somerset BSIP with an eye watering £163 million grant.

Somerset Bus Partnership was set up so that the voices of bus users from across Somerset are heard. We now have over 80 "bus representatives" from all parts of the county who ensure we understand and reflect the needs of towns and parishes across the county. Somerset Bus Partnership was invited to attend the launch of the Bus Advisory Board in late November. This is Somerset's first step in establishing a partnership arrangement with local bus companies.

But seriously, the emergence of a wide range of 'walking' versions of popular sports – including football, rugby, basketball, netball, hockey, rounders and tennis – has seen thousands of those aged 50+ with conditions which limit their participation in the traditional versions, discover a new way to remain active. Not only is it proving physically beneficial but engaging with others in sports is shown to improve mental health and general wellbeing.

A Walking Sport is, understandably, a slower version of a game and rules are adapted to accommodate the slower pace. Those who are addressing weight-related issues or recovering from operations or treatments and undergoing rehabilitation have found walking sports a real aid to improving their condition. Some who suffer from social isolation or loneliness testify to the positive effect these sports have brought them. So, if you are finding that age or disability mean you are having to make adjustments, then a Walking Sport may offer you an opportunity to continue playing a sport you have previously enjoyed.

Now, in Somerset, it is the turn of cricket to 'take a walk'. Steve Gass is the Community Programmes Manager at the Somerset Cricket Foundation (formerly the Somerset Cricket Board), based at the County Ground in Taunton. He is planning to launch Walking Cricket in the new year and would love to hear from any who might be interested in participating in or even helping to organise sessions – which will be held indoors. 


