The small, friendly trustee team meets two or three times per year and consists of four trustees appointed by the named parishes plus three co-opted lay members, supported by a part-time clerk.

So now, should the need arise, there are two defibrillators which could help save a life, especially when minutes are of vital importance.

Developing Kirkham Street Field

Two successful workshops for Kirkham Street Field Community Trust were run by Studio Shaw, the architect team of the Kindred Foundation and took the form of a presentation after which the opportunity for questions provided productive and fruitful discussion.

First a timeline was set out planning a series of workshops over the next six months to work collaboratively with the community to prepare a scheme in keeping with Somerton.

Secondly some very different examples of co-housing were shown from UK and Europe, each then 'planted' within the footprint of the Field to demonstrate how they could 'fit' on a smaller scale. Then we were shown a general look at how the park area could be used in different ways such as woodland, village green, allotment and rewilding with combinations of each shown. More specific discussions will take place later on, linking with the previous Design consultation undertaken by the Trust.

It is planned for two flexible Core Groups to be set up with an average of 12 members involving the community, Kindred Foundation and the Trust. These two Core Groups will be working on the co-housing and park design separately, but coming together at key stages so that the overall design evolves at the same time with the agreement of all parties. Anyone willing to be involved at any stage in either of these Core Groups will be most welcome.

Spotlight on The Library



Without the dedicated oversight of the Trustees and the support of approximately 40 committed volunteers, Somerton Community Library would not function.

Somerton Community Library is run as a partnership between The Somerton Library Trust and Somerset County Council (SCC). The building is leased to the Trust by Somerton Town Council (STC). The County Council is responsible for delivering the library service e.g. books,

talking books, PC access and WiFi. In addition to providing a library service, the library hosts many community activities.

The Trust's primary responsibilities are focused on managing the budget that allows the hire of professional library staff from SCC – by far the Trust's largest expenditure – and providing trained volunteers to augment the SCC library staff.

Funding and donations

STC sets aside funding to support the Trust but there is a continuing need to raise funds to meet an annual deficit of approximately £14,000. Potential donors are asked to contact Ray Thompson or Martyn Smith using the links on our website somertonlibrary.com/supporting-your-library/.

What do we do?

The Somerton Community Library website, somertonlibrary.com, provides details of the services and activities on offer as well as details of new books available for adults, young adults and children. Opportunities for supporting the Trust – financially and as a volunteer – are also included on the website.

Electronic noticeboards outside and inside the library highlight the services provided and activities that take place in the library.

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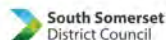
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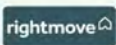


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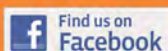

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
