Citizen's Advice Bureau

The library will be open as a Citizen's Advice Bureau between 10.00am and 1.30pm every Monday morning, commencing 20 February 2023. During this period the library will only be used as a CAB and not as a library.





Your council and community need you

Following the receipt of two resignations during January 2023 the council are looking for two new councillors.

What do councillors do?

Local councillors are the champions of the community who invest time in local projects and issues to the benefit of residents and the neighbourhood. Councillors attend to local needs of residents, local groups and businesses, make decisions on local services, collaborate with district and borough councils to adhere to local needs, and progress vital projects to invest in the future of the community.

What do councils do?

Councils lead on community services such as allotments, footpaths, public seating and litter bins, but also larger projects such as the running of local transport, leisure services, youth services and climate change initiatives. These activities are funded by a local tax, called a precept which is determined by the council.

How long does it take?

Councillors put aside on average, one to three hours a week for council work. Council work often includes attending meetings, engaging with residents, and speaking to local groups and bodies on behalf of the council.

Can I stand for election?

You must be:

- A British citizen, or a citizen of the Commonwealth, or the European Union
- 18 years of age or older
- · Live in an area that is served by the local council

The council have also applied for a grant from Avon and Somerset Police Road Safety Trust. The council now have three devices. Two will be permanently sited at Sutton Road and Langport Road, while the third is a mobile unit starting in in West Street and being moved as necessary.

Frogs and toads are counting on you

Somerset Wildlife Trust has recently announced its latest citizen science project, The Frog & Toad Spawn Count, which is running until 31 March 2023.

This is the second year the project has run, and it follows on from a successful pilot in 2022. The project is all about encouraging the public to help collect important data on the location of breeding frogs and toads across Somerset by heading outside and looking out for frog and toad spawn in local ponds.

Frogs and toads are "indicator species", which means they are one of the first species to be affected by the degradation of the environment and the impacts of climate change. This

means that monitoring their populations and breeding habits can help us look after our ponds, rivers, and other aquatic habitats.

It's easy to get involved in the Frog & Toad Spawn Count, and it's a great opportunity to get the family outside and beat the January blues – all you have to do is go online at somersetwildlife.org and download a free welcome pack which tells you all you need to know about Somerset's frogs and toads.



More money-saving hacks

Did you hit the High Street sales in January? Or did you shop from the comfort of home? Too tempting isn't it? But there is a price to pay. The rise of fast fashion by such companies as Boohoo, Primark and ASOS has come at an enormous cost to the planet and our pockets. In 2018, the clothing thrown away in the UK added up to 300,000 tonnes – equivalent to the weight of almost 30 Eiffel Towers. And that does not include all the packaging.

Make material changes

- Buy less: the average person in the UK is buying 60% more clothing than 20 years ago.
- Buy second-hand: use charity shops, car boot sales, eBay, Vinted.
- Buy quality rather than quantity. This does not always mean designer labels.
- Rent or borrow a costume for that special event.
- Repair and up-cycle or re-purpose. Old T-shirts and socks make great polishers. Pillow cases make great hankerchiefs, worn towels can be made into dishcloths.
- Look after your clothes, wash them less frequently at lower temperatures.
- Audit your wardrobe. Be honest, does it still fit? Will you wear the prom dress again? Do you need that many pairs of jeans?

We have all become so used to throwing away that jumper with a hole or socks where toes poke through, or broken zips, or split seams after Xmas binges. It is often possible to fix these garments and save a lot of money. The art of mending has almost been lost. If you cannot do it ask someone who can.

Patchwork is an ideal way to use up all those old clothes. Perhaps join a craft or sewing group, a lovely sociable way to learn a new skill. Patchwork clothes are all the fashion now.

Rock on summertime

Somerstock is a family friendly music festival in the heart of Somerset. 2023 sees the introduction of a Friday night of music on the 7 July, before a full day of bands and family fun on Saturday 8 July. The festival site is on the edge of Somerton, with on-site parking and camping available.

which runs from 6.00pm to 11.00pm, with food stalls and bar. Al O'Kane opens the evening with fiery alt/folk-rock, followed by up-beat covers from Not Like The Others and great new music from Young Martyrs.

Headlining on Saturday, rock legends The Blockheads will be joined by 13 other live bands, providing continuous music from 1.00pm to 11.30pm over three stages with the evening's entertainment rounded off by a silent disco. There will also be children's activities, retail stalls, food stalls and bars.

Joining The Blockheads on the outdoor stages will be Tom and the Clementynes who delighted festival goers in 2019, Matt Owens (formerly of Noah and the Whale) with the Delusional Vanity Project, upbeat country folk from the Jamestown Brothers, stunning rock covers from The Classic Rock Revival, Ska from the Decatonics and high energy from Nick Parker and the False Alarms – once described as 'A British Arcade Fire'. The festival also includes soul from the Charlie Miller Band, reggae from the South West's Bare Foot Bandit and acoustic and alternative acts as well as another famous silent disco.

received from the Somerton community in general and the St. Michael's Church community in particular. As a gesture from her heart Katia has painted a beautiful icon of St. Michael and gifted it to the Church at a service on Sunday morning 4 December 2022. For now, mother and daughter are safe, but other family members remain in Ukraine. Like many in Churches and elsewhere across our land we pray for the war and the violence to end and for peace to be restored.




