Somerset County Council and the four District Councils (Mendip, Sedgemoor, Somerset West and Taunton and South Somerset) came to an end on 31 March 2023, allowing the formation of the unitary authority. All services will now be managed through the unitary authority. The move to a single unitary council introduces the risk of losing the voice of the community at a strategic level. To mitigate the risk, Local Community Networks (LCN's) are being formed, ensuring the new authority does not disconnect from residents. LCNs will provide a forum for all partners, residents and engaged communities to establish priorities and goals for the local areas. Somerton Town Council are part of LCN 16 – Levels and Moors. Currently Somerton Town Council are working alongside Langport Town Council to organise an LCN informal 'get to know you' meeting in May 2023 for representatives of local town and parish councils within the new LCN. More information and updates will be provided as things progress.

#### Report from Land and Property

The new Magic Mountain play equipment, installed in March 2022, has been vandalised. The repair of Magic Mountain is now a high priority and the Town Council have closed the play equipment until this can be carried out. Unfortunately, the replacement parts have a delivery time of no less than six weeks; in the meantime Magic Mountain has been fenced off for people's safety. The Council will be claiming insurance as the repair work is estimated to be more than £13,000. New CCTV will now be installed at the Gassons Lane play park and skate park.

#### Future project work

The project to fit flood lighting to the skate park is progressing and planning permission has been obtained. The project to install an accessible round-a-bout which can accommodate wheelchairs is being worked on and the location will be the Memorial Park at Etsome Terrace. One of the largest projects to come is to find a suitable area of land to enable the council to expand the town's cemetery, as the current cemetery is estimated to reach maximum capacity in six years.


We have a lively programme arranged for the rest of the year, and a warm welcome for members old and new. As well as our regular monthly programme, there are many other activities on offer.

# Cleaning up by Karen Housego

In my last article I wrote about how you can cut down on costs by using non-commercial cleaning products, and be environmentally friendly. Check you can use these products on your surfaces before you start.

BICARBONATE OF SODA SODA CRYSTALS CASTILE LIQUID SOAP WHITE VINEGAR SALT ESSENTIAL OILS OLIVE OIL CITRIC ACID



#### LAUNDRY

Stain Removal: Mix 4 tsp. baking powder with 2 tbsp lukewarm water. Put onto the stain, leave for 10 – 20 minutes. Pat the stain using a damp clean cloth.

For laundry: Pour 30ml or  $^{1/}_{8}$  cup measure of liquid Castile soap into washing machine dispenser. On top of the washing in the drum add 30ml bicarbonate of soda. Wash on 30°C, or less.

#### SURFACES

Floors: To one bucket of water add roughly 1 tsp Castile soap and soda crystals. If the floor is not too dirty use cold water with a little white vinegar as a disinfectant. You can add a few drops essential oil if you wish – if you've a dog, check the oils are safe for them.

Furniture, wood: Pour into a glass bottle ¼ cup olive oil (not virgin) and 5 drops lemon essential oil. Shake. Use on a soft cloth.

Windows: add approximately 30ml white vinegar to a bucket of cold water, you can add bicarbonate if very dirty.

#### BATHROOM

Toilet: In a glass jar mix 1 cup bicarbonate of soda and ¼ cup salt. Mix 1 cup white vinegar and 10 drops tea tree oil in glass spray bottle, shake. Spray liquid around the bowl, the powder mixture in the bowl. Leave 15 mins. Scrub with a brush and flush.

Sinks and shower trays: sprinkle bicarbonate of soda onto the surface, rub clean with a damp cloth and rinse well. If greasy use very hot water.

For many years we have been habitually buying what is bad for the environment and our health. So "To understand a new idea, break an old habit!"


