Free trees are being made available for residents and organisations in Somerton. If you're interested, please let us know by 29th February 2024 by contacting Councillor Martyn.

Trees will be available from April 2024. Species of trees which will be made available are a selection of the following: Crab apple, Hazel, Rowan, Elder, Dogwood, Blackthorn, Dog Rose, Goat Willow, Field Maple, Alder, Hawthorn, Silver Birch and Spindle. Through the Council's commitment to the environment, we are currently looking at which species would be best suited to planting at Edgar Hall, the Cemetery, plus other locations. Please note that the trees will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

Remembrance Parade 2023

The Royal British Legion (RBL) Somerton Branch has, for many years, organised the parade and ceremonial aspects of Remembrance Sunday.

After last year's parade, general feedback was the concern that the road during the parade should be closed to vehicular traffic. RBL policy is that branches should not organise, pay for or deploy a Temporary Traffic Management Order (TTMO) and that this should be arranged by the Civil Authority, in our case, Somerton Town Council.

The RBL have approached the Town Council for support but unfortunately, due to time constraints and having to apply to County Council for a Road Closure Licence, it has been agreed that there is not enough time to put this year's parade in place.

Please be assured that next year, the RBL will engage with the Town Council in plenty of time to ensure that all avenues are explored to reinstate the parade as part of the Remembrance Commemoration in 2024.

With the above in mind, it is regrettable that the 2023 Remembrance Parade is postponed.

The other parts of the Commemoration will take place as usual on Sunday 12th November 2023, comprising of the Remembrance Service in St. Michael's Church at 10.00am following with the Act of Remembrance in the town square, the minute's silence, a flypast (weather dependant) and the laying of wreaths at the War Memorial.

Participating organisations have been contacted individually and invited to take part in uniform with standards paraded on the Church approach and for presentation during the Remembrance Service. Armed Forces and Emergency Service personnel are asked to attend in uniform as is customary.


A flowering of talent


