#### **Remembrance Sunday**

The war dead roll call, which names those fallen whilst serving their Country during conflict, was called out by representatives of the Armed Services and the Royal British Legion. The parade began at 9.30am at Etsome Terrace, continued along West Street and back to Etsome Terrace. The Town Council organised the road closure with Somerset Council Highways, and we would like to thank Chevron who supported the rolling road closure for free, and thank the Kingsbury Episcopi Marching Band for joining the parade along with DJ Ray who supplied the Public Address system (PA). A flypast by pilots from Middlezoy Aerodrome completed the parade. We thank all those involved in organising the event including the Royal British Legion for organising the Parade and Jo Gale for her work raising funds through the Poppy Appeal. This event was a wonderful tribute from our residents and youth groups of Somerton to those fallen. The new vicar from St Michael and All Angels Church, Judith Swan, led the Service of Remembrance and gave her sermon using the milk factory bombing as her inspiration. ### Finance

#### **Grant Funding**

The Budget set for Grant funding in 2024/25 is £51,050, and provides support to local groups and charities, such as the Somerton Library Trust, Somerton Recreation Ground Trust, the Lady Smith Memorial Institute (LSMI) for the Parish Rooms annual insurance, the Somerton Cary Community Shed, plus numerous other local groups which are considered upon receipt of their applications. During the November 2024 meeting the Council agreed to release £10,000 of funds held in Reserves to support the King Ina PTFA outdoor structure, providing shade for students and an outdoor classroom.

During the November Full Council meeting the following grants were awarded. The Library Trust, who drew down the second instalment of their pre-organised and budgeted for financial support, total grant awarded during 2024/25 is £18,000. The Somerton Cary Community Shed were also awarded a grant of £2,000 to support the wellbeing of our residents. The 'Shedders' have now organised the Slinky Bus to stop outside their premises providing easy access for their members.

The grant application form was reconfigured during November to guide applicants in providing greater supporting information to ensure transparency to the Community on where and how their public funds are being spent.

#### Funds held in Reserve

Reserves are reported to the Community annually, The Town Council hold the funds in Reserve for future maintenance and projects to benefit our community.

Some projects are funded through several years of Precept (The Precept is the demand made to Somerset Council who claim this through your Council Tax) ensuring the funds are not demanded in full in any one year. For example, the Cemetery expansion project could cost anywhere up to one million pounds, a consultant would need to be appointed, land purchased, and then converted into use as a Cemetery, following the testing of grounds and ensuring compliance with Cemetery legal requirements. Projects currently earmarked in reserves include but are not limited to; the West Street Pavement Repair/Replacement, Cemetery Expansion project, Car Park Repair and Resurfacing works, Play Equipment & Public toilet facilities repair and replacement and work at Edgar Hall to improve the facilities. Other funds held are Community Infrastructure Levy, (CIL) awarded to the Council through Planning Applications, paid by developers and transferred to the Council to fund Community Assets. Commuted Sums, are funds held by the Town Council to maintain Capital Projects funded through S106 agreements (S106 funds are drawn down from Somerset Council through Planning Application S106 agreements). These funds are held for the future benefit of our community.

#### Budgeting 2025/26

The Council Committees proposed a draft budget increase of £16,586 (2.651%) for 2025/26, but following agenda item STC2251 on the 12th of November 2024 an adjustment to the Administration Budget will be made and the Budget brought back to the Full Council Agenda in January 2025 to finalise.

The Administration Budget will increase due to salaries and the increase includes the changes to National Insurance Contributions (following the Chancellor's Autumn Budget update on 30th October 2024, increasing employer NIC from 13.8% to 15%, and the reduction of the NIC threshold reducing from £9,100 to £5,000). Following the adjustments, the final Budget will be brought back to the Janaury agenda at £654,248, which is an increase of £28,656, (4.581%). The Budget will be finalised before the Precept demand is discussed and set for 2025/26. (The Precept is the demand made to Somerset Council who claim this through your Council Tax, this funds the Services the Town Council manage on behalf of our residents).

The Town Council are very sad to report that we have been unable to hang Christmas lights along Broad Street this year, as we have not been granted permission from Somerset Council - Highways Trees, to pollard the trees that enables us access to hang wires required to support the lights. However, there are plenty of other festive decorations being hung in the Town, which includes in addition to the icicle lights, two new snowflake decorations, two large trees (Market Place, 20ft and Cow Square, 16ft,) that will complement the 60 smaller Christmas trees which run through the Town Centre.

### Somerton SpeedWatch

Another year is coming to a close and we would like to thank so many of you for your support and wish you all a happy and safe Christmas and New Year. Any time of year can be dangerous for motorists, riders and pedestrians, but with the darker mornings and evenings we ask you to consider each other and respect the speed limits.

You might be interested to know that during October the highest speed of vehicles travelling along Sutton Road has been recorded at 41 mph approaching the town and 57 mph leaving. West Street recorded speeds of 50 mph coming in, and 69 mph going out, whilst at Langport Road speeds of 98 mph were recorded coming into Somerton and 121 mph leaving. This is why SpeedWatch are determined to keep supporting the safety of the community and will continue to keep going as although these statistics are extreme, we are fortunate that they are not common. A new system which records persistent and high speeders will flag up this type of driver and the police will follow up. SpeedWatch do not want to report anyone, but for the sake of children, older pedestrians and everyone inbetween we ask you to be a careful and thoughtful driver. We will continue to work with the police to ensure safe and sensible driving through Somerton. ### An NHS Initiative to keep you healthy.



My name is Michelle Bell and I am an infection control nurse working at NHS Somerset.

In recent years the NHS has seen a noticeable increase in men over 70 developing urinary tract infections. Good hydration is known to significantly reduce such infections and prevent visits to emergency services. This project aims to provide hydration advice and resources to men over 70 living in their own homes. We will achieve this by providing information and

education relating to hydration and providing resources which include a water bottle and other goodies to serve as ongoing reminders to keep drinking during the day.

We will ask you to complete a very brief questionnaire to establish base data of your current hydration and health. We will also ask for your consent to being contacted 1 month later to identify any level of improvement gained from your involvement in the project.


