

Budget and Precept by Committee 2023/24 to 2025/26

The budget and precept have been set and the demand made to Somerset Council to collect through your council tax. The Town Council made the decision and resolution to ensure that they do not increase your Precept from 2024/25 to 2025/26, so to ensure this and after the tax base calcuation a reserve release of £14,048.00 has been used to offset the increase in the budget for 2025/26, thus ensuring a zero percent increase.

Somerton Community Association (SCA)

SCA, founded in 1997, the association has funded many projects for the benefit of the community through funds received through landfill tax. In 2024 the following projects were undertaken:-

Chairs & tables for AceArts to make their exhibition space more comfortable for visitors (their Red Dress exhibition attracted over 12,000 visitors!)

Lighting improvement on the MUGA at the recreation ground for wider use, particularly in winter

Ceiling fans in the library for better temperature control

CCTV for the library which has already proved useful

Replacement of the rotting floor in the Pinney Room at the Parish Rooms

It is also noteworthy that most of the project work was carried out by local companies/tradesmen, so that's an additional bonus.

None of these projects could have been carried out without receipt of the landfill tax (landfill tax which is injected back into the community at a charge of as much as £100/tonne). In 2024, the landfill tax reclaimed was a whopping £27,391!




