WELFARE ADVICE

There are still a number of people not receiving the Welfare Advice they are entiled to and subsequently are missing out on various benefits. The South Somerset District Council Welfare Advice Team can provide valuable advice and assistance. So, if you are unsure and want further advice then please call 01935 462462. Somerset Citizen's Advice, Age UK and Yarlington Housing Group can also provide advice to local residents on a range of financial and welfare issues.

NEW MODEL OF CARE- SYMPHONY HEALTH SERVICES- SOMERSET.

With the advent of the Vanguard projects across the UK, here in Somerset we took the opportunity to look at how we could deliver "Intermediate" level specialist care in a faster more direct route (and closer to home!). Buttercross Health Centre has been our pilot surgery for this and the respiratory service , the first specialist service to work this way.

This means that for some problems, such as difficult to control asthma, COPD or oxygen issues, when a referral would have been made by your GP or practice nurse to Yeovil Hospital we now have access to a Clinical Nurse Specialist to see you at Buttercross—usually within two weeks. Many problems are able to be resolved for the patient at this level as our team of clinical nurse specialist are also independent prescribers— if more complex intervention is thought to be needed, then of course the patient would still be referred to see a consultant physician.

So far we have seen around 50 Somerton area patients in this way and patient feedback has been very positive indeed. The next stages for symphony working in this way are to see other specialities and to be able to see patients from other surgeries, but still in that location.
