SOMERTON REMEMBERS – SILENT SOLDIERS

1918 - 2018 WORLD WAR I



Last month I wrote about Margaret Somerville's grandfather who died at his demobilisation parade in 1919. His widow worked in the Post Office in Oxford and married a builder who worked nearby. He had been at a sheep station in Australia in 1914 and had joined the Australian 4th Light Horse Regiment. They served in Palestine and he was awarded a Distinguished Conduct Medal for leading a patrol into Damascus and capturing 10,000 Turkish soldiers.

Brian Tiffin has lent us an album of photographs which his father took when he was in Egypt recovering from the Gallipoli campaign. He transferred to the Machine Gun Corps in 1916 and was promoted to 2nd Lieutenant in early 1918. Window stickers available in the library in aid of the Royal British Legion: A3 minimum donation £6; A4 minimum donation £3. Do you have a story to tell about a relation from anywhere in the world who served in the First World War? The stories are being collected in folders in the Library and will be included in a web site.

MESSAGE FROM COUNTY COUNCILLOR DEAN RUDDLE

As you may have read in the local press, I have resigned as chair of the Audit Committee of Somerset County Council. As chair of that committee, it was my responsibility to try to ensure that different departments stick to their budgets. I made it quite clear to the leader of Council and the Chief Executive that the overspend of £20M in Children's Services is unacceptable. I agree that County finances are in a difficult state, yet we seem to be saving minor amounts on other services to prop up such overspends. For example, saving £16K by withdrawing the Saturday Park & Ride service in Taunton and trying to make a paltry saving of £400K in the Library Service (putting considerable pressure on towns if they wish to keep their library). I will of course still look after the interests of my constituents in Somerton and the surrounding villages and will still remain as chair of Somerton Town Council and as the District Councillor for South Somerset. 
