ENHANCE YOUR CREATURE COMFORTS IN THE PARISH ROOMS

HOW YOUR PRESCRIPTION IS DEALT WITH

We at the PPG thought it may be helpful to explain how prescriptions are dealt with through the surgery – and it has proven an interesting exercise!

A prescription can begin its life in one of two ways: either a visit to the doctors or a repeat of something prescribed before. If you visited the doctor and a prescription is produced there and then, it will be sent electronically to the the pharmacy of your choice to be collected at a later point that day or you can ask for a printed version of this prescription to take to the pharmacy yourself. There is a possibility that the item will not be available the same day if the pharmacy needs to order it in.

When a patient requests a repeat prescription, the physical process of the surgery checking and authorising the drugs takes up to two working days. The prescription will then be sent electronically to the pharmacy of your choice where they will process the items. If this is the Boots Somerton pharmacy, they need up to two working days to process the prescription. This takes into consideration ordering the item in where necessary. After the two working days, you will be able to collect the item from Boots in Somerton.

The local Somerton pharmacy also offer a service that enables you to leave an ongoing repeat prescription with them. The patient is then contacted by text message or phone to advise that item is ready for collection. This is an independent arrangement which you can sign up to. Local advertisements were recently circulated concerning a company called Pharmacy Plus. This is another independent organisation who deliver to your door. They are not affiliated with the Buttercross Health Centre or the local pharmacy and therefore patients must be aware that if they have an emergency episode, their details are no longer held at our local pharmacy and they will need to specify if they wish to have their emergency prescription dealt with locally.

We have been advised by the Buttercross Health Centre that they are in the process of simplifying ongoing multiple repeat prescriptions for their patients. This means that if you are in receipt of several different items during the month, in time, your items will coincide so that trips to the pharmacy can be minimised. You may also notice that the drugs come in different packaging from time to time, this is because they will be supplied under their generic names rather than branded products. They will be the same items. We hope that you have found this information helpful and if you have any queries, please be in touch with the Buttercross Health Centre.

CASH-4-CLUBS OPENS FOR APPLICATIONS (UK)

Local grassroots community sports clubs in the UK that require funding for equipment, facilities or coaching can apply for grants of £250, £500, £750 and £1000 through Cash-4-Clubs. The Cash 4 Clubs scheme is funded by Betfair and is supported by SportsAid. No preference is given as to the types of sport or the age range accessing the activity; however clubs should play an active role in the community, encourage social interaction and fitness, and be registered with their sports' National Governing body.

Previous projects supported include Strictly Wheelchair Dancing which received a grant of £750 to purchase new wheelchairs and Solihull Cycling Club which received a grant of £600 to provide coaching staff with additional training;

BEYOND LANDFILL – SOMERSET'S SEARCH BEGINS

Somerset is widening its residual waste treatment options beyond costly landfill in the search for better solutions that continue to meet residents' needs and make significant financial savings. Outside its contract with waste firm Viridor, Somerset Waste Partnership (SWP) is asking waste treatment suppliers for alternatives to deal with more than 120,000

tonnes of refuse each year. SWP currently spends £12 million a year of council taxpayers' money on landfill. After recent years' budget reductions, it wants the switch from landfill to save at least £1.3 million a year.

LANDFILL WARNING ON RUBBISH FIRE RISKS

A fire that started in rubbish being landfilled at the Dimmer site in July took Devon & Somerset Fire & Rescue Service and site operator Viridor several days to bring under control.

While the investigation into the Dimmer fire's cause proved inconclusive, Somerset Waste Partnership (SWP) has warned that adding the wrong items to rubbish bins could put lives at risk.

Among the danger items that should never be add to the rubbish bin are:

- Hot ash or part-burned materials from domestic or garden fires or barbeques.
- Used portable barbeques whose charcoal may not be completely cold.
- Household or vehicle batteries as these may short out or cause sparks.
- Broken glass not carefully wrapped or bagged as it could act as a magnifying lens.
- Aerosols as they may get hot or be pierced during the landfill process.

MID WESSEX SINGERS' NEW MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Bryan Anderson, a recent graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, will take on the role of Musical Director of the Mid Wessex Singers in September. Bryan, who is Senior Organ Scholar at Wells Cathedral, will be rehearsing the singers for their Christmas and Spring concerts. The Christmas concert will include a performance of parts of Bach's Christmas Oratorio.

Steph Berry, Chair of Mid Wessex Singers, said 'We are so fortunate over the years to have had extremely talented and passionate musicians to guide us and share in our love of singing. Each brings his or her unique approach and expertise and as amateurs we have benefited so much from the challenge, learning new skills and feeling confident in our performances. We are looking forward to working with Bryan, who is coming from the USA.'

Bryan's most recent positions have been as organist and assistant choirmaster at St. Mark's Episcopal Church and Tenth Presbyterian Church, both in Philadelphia. Bryan was also an assistant organist of the Wanamaker Grand Court Organ.

He has been described as "simply first class" (Classical Voice of North Carolina) and "brilliant" (The Diapason). A rising performer and collaborator, Bryan has performed at venues including the Kennedy Center, Verizon Hall in Philadelphia, Woolsey Hall at Yale, Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City, and the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York.
