FOOD WASTE RECYCLING TRIAL

A campaign to encourage more recycling of food waste by 115,000 households in Somerset has proved a major success. Based on earlier trials in Street and Wellington, food waste recycling in Taunton Deane, Sedgemoor and the Chard-Ilminster area of South Somerset jumped 20%.

If that rate is maintained, an annual extra 1,570 tonnes of food will be recycled, saving Somerset council tax payers £51,000 every year. All food waste in Somerset is transformed into electricity and agricultural compost for local farmers at an anaerobic digestion plant near Bridgwater.

As well as saving money, recycling food avoids it decaying for decades in landfill and giving off the potent greenhouse gas methane that contributes to climate change. For more information see : www.somersetwaste.gov.uk/collections/food/liners.

The National Village Halls Forum says volunteers should not have to fundraise to pay VAT bills on improvement work to charity run community facilities. The Forum, which campaigns on behalf of 10,000 community buildings in rural England, is urging the Government to introduce tax breaks and support for volunteer trustees . The Forum has identified that small amounts of carefully directed Government funding will help volunteer trustees provide facilities that are more financially viable, support new social enterprises and help improve the economy and social fabric of rural areas. The Forum is asking firstly for the refund of VAT paid on improvement projects, secondly for finance

Please note there are no meetings planned for August with the exception of planning meetings if required.

SALE OF TWO BUILDING PLOTS AT ETSOME TERRACE

STC have been granted planning permission for two bungalows on the land at Etsome Terrace (to the rear of the fire station & play area).

It has been agreed to sell these plots via a public auction to be held in September. An agent has been engaged to manage the sale process and particulars will be available from them shortly. Details will be on the marketing board to be located at the site.

- STC have approved a provisional grant of £1000 towards a new heating system in the Parish Rooms.
- STC are sponsoring the Flower Show which take place on Saturday 22nd August .The committee of the Somerton Gardeners' Club has once again agreed to judge the garden competition in the town next month and the prizes will be presented to the winners of the best gardens at the show. Profits from the event will be donated to St Margaret's Hospice.
- Somerton Play Day is being hosted at the Recreation Ground on 27th August.

Fly tipping / waste carriers licence: Due to the fly tipping in and around Somerton we request that residents check the waste carriers licence of anyone who is going to dispose of your garden or household waste. This will ensure it will be disposed of at refuse recycling depots or licensed waste sites.

• Vulnerable Adults: We have received a request that STC have a Vulnerable Adults Coordinator. STC consider this to be a specialist role that is better served by County or District Council Officers, however STC will review its safeguarding policy to ensure that vulnerable adults are included.

- STC have reviewed the opportunity to have a sound system /microphones in the Conference room at Edgar Hall for council meetings. The costs are prohibitive at this stage ranging from £2.5K to over £5K.
- The council owned van which failed its MOT will be put up for Sale and this will be placed on eBay in early August.
- Councillors supported a proposal to remove the ash tree in the Market Square car park due to the damage being caused by the root structure. The tree will be replaced prior to the car park being resurfaced in the next couple of months.
- Cllr Judith Hurley and Kelly Kay will be at the White Hart in Somerton on 25th July 2015 from 10.30 am-12pm to encourage members of the Youth Council with other youth leaders in the area.
- STC are moving to online banking with Unity Trust bank as soon as the required paperwork is completed. This will save money in bank charges and be more efficient to process payments.
- There has been a delay in the manufacture of signage for the one way system for Brunel Bridge.
- West Street vacant shops: The woodwork has been painted and vinyl prints for the shop windows have been ordered, all at no cost to STC.
- Laminate information sheets listing contact telephone for services are now in place at the library.
- Street lighting orders have been placed for School Lane & Camden Orchard.
- Somerton Speedwatch have completed a survey of Gassons Lane and St Cleers Way.
- All work has now been completed on the car park white lining.
- For the parking issues raised at Polham Lane, Somerset County Council has been notified and a response will be issued by Gary Warren in due course.
- County Highways have done minor repairs in and around Somerton. e.g. blocked drain and broken kerb and drain clearance.
- The mechanical road brush has had mechanical issues of late and Street Scene, are in the process of replacing both of their sweepers.
- Due the growing season we have had to do extra grass cutting and strimming in various areas of Somerton.
- A new contractor has been appointed for grass & verge cutting.
- Hedge trimming: It should be noted that any overhanging hedges or brambles that encroach on to a public path or highway are the responsibility of the property owner to keep trimmed.
- Road side seat at Perry Hill will be replaced with a new one by relatives in memory of Mrs Knight, late of Somerton.
- Two new replacement litter/dog bins have been installed at the lay-by in Langport Road and Bancombe Road.
- Two parking bays dedicated for the use of LSMI & Church users only and a delivery bay are to be sited on the cobbles at the LSMI. These will not interfere with church activities.

- A contractor has been accepted and resurfacing will begin of the Market Square as soon as the ash tree has been felled and a new tree planted.
- Additional works have been identified in the new Yarlington car park in the form of safety barriers. The costs have been agreed and we are awaiting installation.
- Surface and a sunken drain have been repaired in the Brunel Precinct.
- Christmas Lights: The Lights Brigade have taken over the organisation and management of the installation of christmas lights in the town. They will report regularly to the Council about their progress and the finances.
- Street Market: The organisers of the street market presented their proposals for a monthly street market in the area around the Buttercross and the area near the War Memorial. It was agreed that these are accepted in principle. There are currently investigations about the day on which it can be held.

PRESS RELEASE - INCREASE IN FREE CAR PARKING SPACES IN SOMERTON

Somerton Town Council will be increasing the number of free car parking spaces in Somerton. The planned changes resulting from the car park strategy will provide additional free parking spaces to encourage more visitors to the town, supporting the shops and businesses to thrive.

The agreed proposal is to standardise all free parking at 4 hours, an increase from the current 3 hours. However, there is an option to review this in the autumn to coincide with the planning application process, for the demolition of the doctors surgery and creation of 44 additional free car park spaces.

The planned changes will bring an additional cost of £9000 per annum to the town. Rather than increase the burden on the Council Tax payers, the Council has agreed that a nominal charge of £1 for 5 hours or £2 per day will be made at the Paddock House car park **only**. The Paddock House car park is situated away from the main visitor/shopper parking areas. However, for those who park their cars whilst at work in the town, a parking permit supplied by Somerton Town Council will be available for a nominal administration fee of £1 per week. Permit parking will be identifiable by blue lining and the allocated 40 spaces will be distributed by 10 bays in Paddock House car park, 15 in the Half Moon car park and 15 in the Yarlington car park (a designated permit holders car park).

The Council confirms that there are no plans to introduce charges elsewhere in the town, and indeed the number of free parking spaces will be increased. Its intention is help the town to thrive by attracting visitors and shoppers and hope that the free additional 49 parking spaces will contribute to this, with limited cost to rate payers. Once implemented the Car Parking Scheme will be reviewed after 12 months.
