The loan on the surgery site and Edgar Hall will be repaid leaving the council free of any long-term loans.

A ten-year financial forecast has been approved by councillors

ROAD CLOSURES

The junction of Northfield and Waverley will be closed to vehicles from August 7th for around 8 weeks. Pedestrian access will be maintained.

Behind Berry will be closed to vehicles between Pinewood and North St from August 7th for approximately 3 weeks to enable the construction of footway and resurfacing works. Access for pedestrians will be maintained as will access to the cemetery.

The other part of Behind Berry between Pinewood and Pound Pool will be closed for 3 days from Wednesday 30th August (9.30am-5.30pm) for resurfacing works.

These last two closures will affect bus services. Buses of Somerset have told us that the 77 service will travel as far as the Market Square and then turn round and continue to its destination (either Yeovil or Wells). The 54 service will run both ways along West St and will not serve Behind Berry

SPORTS CLUB LEASE

This press release is issued reluctantly and earlier than had been intended, as 'negotiations with the Sports Club' are not yet complete. However there is the need to provide certain information to the wider public following recent comments in the press and at public meetings.

The Recreation Ground is administered solely by the Recreation Ground Trust, which consists of members of the town council, acting as Charity Trustees, and it is this Trust that is responsible for leasing the Sports Club.

Following the Audit Report in early 2012, it was agreed that a review of all leases would be undertaken, including the 2002 lease for the Sports Club.

On detailed inspection it became apparent that both parties had entered into this lease when they were not legally able to do so, this point being confirmed following legal advice obtained.

This lease called for the Sports Club to pay £1,000 per month to the Recreation Ground Trust by way of rent, with a similar sum being made available to the Sports Club from the Trust to cover the cost of maintaining the grounds. No payments were actually made, either way, and until 2008 the Sports Club duly maintained the ground. However, since 2008 the ground has been maintained by the Recreation Ground Trust and not the Sports Club, but no money has been received by the Trust from the Sports Club since then in terms of rent.

As the ground is for the use and benefit of the residents of Somerton, the Trustees feel that the situation needs to be rectified, ensuring an appropriate level of funding for the use of the Sports Club, having had an independent valuation carried out to establish rental values. On this basis a new lease was offered to the Sports Club at the beginning of March 2013, with new conditions (compared to the 2002 lease) with the liability for all works on the Recreation Ground being met by the Trustee, but with the Sports Club paying a fair rent for their tenancy, the funds being used for the maintenance and improvement of the Recreation Ground site.

The Trust and Sports Club failed to reach agreement related to this lease and any further discussions ceased in 2014.

In December 2016 Greenslade Taylor Hunt were appointed to act on behalf of the Trust to negotiate a lease with the Sports Club. Following a meeting with a representative from the Sports Club, draft heads of terms were issued to the Sports Club for consideration in February 2017, with an acknowledgement from the Sports Club secretary that they would be considered in March 2017. Some progress was made related to the heads of terms with the main areas to be resolved being the annual rental payment and the status of the snooker club in relation to the lease. On 16th June Battens solicitors representing the Sports Club requested a meeting with the trust. The trust was agreeable to this and supplied six possible separate dates over the following month, with the final date of 14th July. As of that date no response has been received from Battens or the Sports Club. The Trust has now passed the resolution of the lease to its solicitors Weller Hedley.

The Trust is clear that the current situation needs to be resolved and hope that an agreement can be made with the Sports Club and that the two organisations can work together for the benefit of the Recreation Ground and the people of Somerton.

The Recreation Ground Trust seeks to clarify the position of the chair of the trust following the Annual General Meeting on 5th July 2017.

At that meeting the first agenda item was the election of Chairman as it had been for the previous two AGM, this was based on the interpretation of the Trust Governing document. Following advice from a Trust Solicitor and Somerset Association of Local Councils (SALC) it transpires that this interpretation was incorrect. Where the Town Council is the sole trustee the chair of the council will be the chair of the trust.

If the trust chair is not present at the AGM then a chairman is elected for that meeting. On the basis of this advice, Dean Ruddle as chair of Somerton Town Council is chair of the Recreation Ground Trust. The Trust would like to thank Brian Raybould for chairing the AGM.

We apologise for any confusion and recognise that the governing document dated 8th March 1996 may require some updating to avoid any future misunderstanding and have asked Terry Philpott in his capacity as Secretary to the Trust to undertake a review.
