THREATENED WITHDRAWAL OF DEFRA FUNDING FOR ACRE - THE NETWORK OF RURAL COMMUNITY COUNCILS

Please join our urgent campaign to call on the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs not to withdraw funding for the ACRE Network of rural community councils (RCC's). The Network, of which Community Council for Somerset is a member, is the only nationwide organisation with a dedicated rural focus; building community resilience, strengthening local enterprise and supporting the most vulnerable in our society. In addition, we are the sole network that provides advice to the 80,000 volunteers who keep England's 10,000 village halls alive. We have been supported by Government investment for decades. Now, however, we have been advised by civil servants to expect no further funding from Defra. If funding is withdrawn - which at present levels contributes just over 67% of our core unrestricted funding - we would be unable to maintain the central office functions which allow us to deliver our project work. One very important project area is Somerset Village Agents which I know you are aware of and have wholeheartedly supported. Our bid to expand county wide is being appraised by the Big Lottery Fund and every indication is that we will be successful. Without Defra funding we cannot maintain the important managerial, administrative, financial and HR functions which underpin our work and the project will not be able to proceed. This would have severe and far-reaching consequences for the vulnerable and isolated people of Somerset who rely on the Village Agents support, many of whom relied heavily on that support during last winters flooding crisis.

To pull the Defra funding now would fracture the Network, undermine decades of government investment and leave the most vulnerable in rural areas with nowhere to go.

If you are able to give examples of how CCS has made a difference to you, your community or organisation, this would be very helpful.

Please beware if you are called by somebody with an Indian accent calling himself Kevin (or whatever), saying that he is from the Caller Protection Service, or Telephone Protection Service, pretending they are government backed and giving the number 08451 297936. He will say that a high number of nuisance calls have been reported to your postcode and then go on to try to sell you a gizmo to attach to your telephone that will block all such calls and then pass you to a female "area manager" and try to charge you £89.00 plus a small monthly fee for the service. The "area manager" is quite aggressive and becomes very ratty at negative responses. Some have been caught by this as CPS sound very convincing. This is a scam and if you do a Google search on the telephone number you will see dozens of negative comments about it. Do not be caught. Put the phone down.

PRECEPT 2015/16

The precept for 2015/16 has been maintained at the same level as 2014/15 £295740, this is projected to result in a 1.4% decrease in a band D property

CAR PARK STRATEGY AND DOCTORS SURGERY

To meet the needs of the Town Centre both now and in the future, following a period of public consultation the following has been agreed:

STC agreed to sell the Doctors Surgery to SSDC for £175K. SSDC would receive a rental income from STC of £9K pa. SSDC will then project manage the site development into a car park with the addition of 44 spaces, at a cost of £40K. The cost of the project to be paid for by STC from the funds received from the sale.

A long term pay and display car park will be created on the Paddock House site charging £2 per day, with the aim of providing spaces for visitors to the town centre who want to stay for longer than the three hour restriction in the main body of the car park. A review of season tickets and other options for those people working/parking in Somerton for a number of days per week will be undertaken before any charging is introduced.

STC will take over responsibility (from SSDC) for the Half Moon Car Park. Immediate priority will be to work with SSDC to improve the lighting prior to handover.

- A new website for Edgar Hall bookings is planned to be in place by the end of January / early February.
- Two long term loans have been repaid related to the Sports Club and the Cox's Yard Car Park.

- Thanks to the SSDC Street scene for the clear up operation on New Year's Day.
- The Town Council and others will be supporting the Forces March Saturday 23rd May (approx 11am in Somerton)
- Gratitude expressed for the Christmas Lights, and the appreciation to the Lights Brigade for doing a wonderful job putting them up and taking them down.
- South Somerset District Council plan has been concluded as 'sound' by the inspector and will be ready for adoption in March 2015.
- The Annual Parish Meeting will be held w/c 23rd March 2015
