- STC have completed the end of year accounts which appear on the STC website, they have been sent to the external auditor for approval. members of the public can view the accounts and discuss the content of the report by contacting Terry Philpott, Town Clerk at the STC office.

TOUR OF WESSEX CYCLE EVENT

This year the Recreation Ground Trust again hosted the Pendragon Cycle event, Tour of Wessex, which took place over the May Bank Holiday weekend of 23rd May to 25th May 2015.

The weather for the event was mostly dry and all the entrants enjoyed the three days and commented on how well signed the routes were. The security, provided by 3D Security of Taunton, advised that on the four evenings/nights they were on duty no major incidents arose. The general consensus is that they manage the security very professionally.

The two groundsmen supervised the use of the field both by those camping on site for the duration of the event and the Pendragon organiser. We thank them for their work in preparing for the event, in conjunction with the Sports Club, and protecting our pitches.

The Rotary tent, manned by volunteers from both Langport & Somerton Rotary Club and Brue Valley Rotary Club, were busy providing breakfasts and lunches for the eventers and their families. The two charities these Rotary Clubs are supporting this year are:

- a) The National Association of Blood Bikes.
- b) Wheelpower. This charity provides opportunities for disabled people to live healthy active lifestyles through sport. They support the Para Olympics.

The amount raised for these charities has not currently been calculated.

The role of the Recreation Ground Management Committee, on the three mornings of the event, was to provide parking off site and both volunteer marshalls and signage to manage the parking. The volunteer marshalls were on site from 6.00am - 8.00am on each of the three mornings. It will be of interest to the community that the marshalls parked 400 cars on Saturday, 360 cars on Sunday and 280 cars on Monday. As an indication of the need for the support from our volunteer marshalls;

on the Saturday morning of the event they parked 6 cars between 6.00am - 6.30am, 30 cars between 6.30am - 7.00am but by 7.45am they had parked 400 cars.

BUTTERCROSS HEALTH CENTRE

As many of you know, the Patient Participation Group is working hard alongside the practice to bring changes and ensure the voice of the patient is heard. There are many challenges faced by Doctors surgeries in the UK and Somerton is no exception. We are delighted for Dr Rachel Boyland that her family will be expanding and that she will go on maternity leave this August - Also some great news for Dr Joanne Cummings, that she has been appointed to be the clinical lead at Yeovil District Hospital for the Complex Care Project, which is a new initiative for Primary Care in the local area. In order to cover these changes in our Practice, the partners from within the group will be based at the Buttercross whilst some recruiting is taking place.

In response to patient requests for a male GP to be in clinic regularly, Dr Pro Sarker (partner), will be offering clinics until Dr Martin Minogue (partner), joins the team at the Buttercross. Dr Becky Sales will go to cover Dr Sarkers clinics while he is with us in Somerton.

The clinical team will be expanding at the Buttercross from July 1st, when Sharyn Rayner, the Lead Nursing Practitioner will take up her post. She will be working alongside Dr Zoe Fox who will be the clinical lead and is also a partner in the practice.

We are confident that our Health Centre Management team is making some solid appointments.

The newly introduced telephone consultation scheme, although having had a few teething difficulties, is now working well and has freed up the GP's diaries so that all patients are being seen in a timely manner by the clinician who can best serve their needs. The PPG have been actively seeking feedback from the patients. The Nurse Practitioners, who have specialisms in various areas, will often be able to give us, as patients, specific care, answers and advice and we can trust their training and professionalism. This enhanced primary care service will continue to grow, bringing along a whole range of specialisms working at the practice alongside our GPs.

CHANGE OF LOWER AGE LIMIT FROM 4 YEARS OLD TO 2 YEARS OLD

ADDING AN EARLY YEARS PROVISION

Proposal Summary

King Ina Academy (Infants) is an education provider for 4 to 7 year olds with 117 pupils on roll.

On 28th April 2015 Roundabouts Pre-School approached the Headteacher with a proposal for King Ina Academy (Infants) to take over the pre-school. The current management of the pre-school falls under the responsibility of a voluntary committee. Committee members generally stay in post for a period of one year and in recent years it has become increasingly difficult to recruit new members.

Whilst the staffing structure of the pre-school remains consistent, ranging from 4 years' service to 24 years' service, the constant struggle for and change of management provides a lack of security for staff and children in Somerton.

The aim of the Directors of the academy is to extend their age range by 2 years to incorporate the pre-school by 1st September 2015. Combining the expertise of all Early Years staff, facilities and resources across the entire phase will provide an extremely high standard of education for children from the age of 2, enable effective progression and a smooth transition to Key Stage 1.

There will be an information meeting held at the school on 15th July 2015 where the proposal will be explained in more detail and people will have the opportunity to express their views in person

These can also be expressed in writing to the Board of Directors by completing the accompanying short consultation response form.

Local Context

Somerton is approximately in the middle of Somerset, set in a rural area. The nearest town, Langport, has only one childcare provision which is not / only marginally sufficient for the needs of its town. There are pre-school provisions in neighbouring villages, though these are not open over a full working day and are unlikely to meet the needs of working parents. There are two childcare provisions in Somerton: One is on the infant school site in the middle of town, and the other is open full day on an industrial estate to the north-east of the town outside the main urban area.

The setting on the outskirts is more popular with parents coming into the area, probably because it is open all day and meets the needs of working parents. The children who attend this setting go on to primary schools all over the area further suggesting that this provision attracts working parents. Children attending the setting in town tend to go on to King Ina Academy (Infants).

There are plans to construct 133 new houses at Northfield Farm, which will be roughly equidistant from both provisions. Approximately 19 children aged 0-4 are expected to arise from the new development, requiring 6 childcare places.

Child population

The 0-4 (inclusive) population in the above area is:

Figures come from the GP register (November 2014). The number of 0-yr old children always appears lower than it actually is due to delays in children being registered with a GP.

Summary of places

Child-minders - Sufficient - 6 excess places

0-2 group places – Insufficient (marginally) – 4 places required

3-4 group places – Sufficient (marginally) – 3 excess places

EYE places – Marginally sufficient in the summer term

Overall, Somerton has only just enough childcare places, so the loss of one provision would create substantial problems for the local community. The new housing development will add to the local demand

School performance

King Ina Academy (Infants) received an outstanding Ofsted rating in January 2014, Roundabout Pre-School were inspected in November 2014 and were considered to be in need of improvement. By combining the expertise of all Early Years staff, facilities and resources across the entire phase it will

provide an extremely high standard of education for children from the age of 2 also enabling effective progression and a smooth transition to Key Stage 1.

Governing Body

King Ina Academy (Infants) is governed by the Board of Directors of King Ina Church of England MAT. Therefore, there would be no change of governance implication.

Admissions over subscription criteria

A change of lower age limit from 4 years old to 2 years old will not affect the school's admissions over subscription criteria. Therefore, there will be no change.

Finance and accommodation

Roundabout Pre-School is a well-established, financially viable going concern which has been running successfully since 1988.

Maximum floor capacity is 26 children, offering morning and afternoon sessions, providing a maximum of 52 sessions per day.

Working within current staff limitations occupancy for the summer term 2015 is 87%.

In a bid to increase business a lunch time session was introduced in April 2014. As anticipated this increased demand for places and with the latest government changes to increase funded hours for working parents, providing staffing hours were increased, the pre-school would be in a position to achieve a maximum occupancy rate of 52 sessions per day from September 2015 Roundabout Pre-School currently operates from a new building, erected in April 2014, situated on a piece of land adjacent to the infant school under the ownership of Somerset County Council. Upon completion SCC will transfer these assets to the academy. There are no outstanding liabilities.

PROGRESSING TO AN ACADEMY OF CHURCH OF ENGLAND DESIGNATION CONSULTATION DOCUMENT

Introduction

King Ina Academy (Infants) joined Monteclefe Church of England Academy to form a Multi Academy Trust (MAT), named King Ina Church of England Academy on 1st September 2014. The MAT provides primary education for the children of Somerton and the surrounding rural areas. The directors of the trust have been considering the long-term future of the schools as part of their continuing commitment to achieving the best possible outcomes for the children and the local community. Following discussion the directors of the trust have concluded that in the interest of the children, parents and the school would be best served by exploring the possibility of a change of category from non-denominational to a Church of England designated school.

There will be an information meeting held at the school on 17/06/15 at 4pm where the proposal will be explained in more detail and people will have the opportunity to express their views in person.

These can also be expressed in writing to the Board of Directors by completing the accompanying short consultation response form.

Why Change?

In March 2013 King Ina C of E Academy, formerly Monteclefe C of E Academy, were inspected by the National Society Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) and rated as "Outstanding". The schools strengths were recognised as:

- The headteacher's creative Christian vision for the school, which is well supported by the governors and inspires both staff and pupils
- The close links between the local church and the school which include, currently, shared use of the school building for Sunday services
- The confidence, happiness and progress of the children

'The school's Christian values shine out in its daily life and each child is seen as unique.'

The directors of the trust would like to ensure the opportunities provided to the junior children are extended, in their entirety, to the infant children.

The Board of Directors aim is to build a new school to accommodate the infants and the juniors on one site and formally merge the two schools to one primary school. To form a primary school the infant school adopting Church of England designation is a Diocesan prerequisite.

What would change and what would not change? Staffing

King Ina Church of England MAT is the employer of all staff across the two schools. Therefore, there would be no staff change implications.

Religious Education

The syllabus for RE is decided by the Board of Directors. At King Ina Academy (infants/juniors) RE is currently taught using Somerset's Agreed Syllabus and this would continue for the foreseeable future.

Governing Body

King Ina Academy (Infants) is governed by the Board of Directors of the MAT. Therefore, there would be no change of governance implication.

Collective Worship

The collective worship of the school already reflects the wide range of Christian resources and ethos of the Junior School including assemblies being regularly led by the local clergy. Therefore, there will be no changes in the content of collective worship.

Inclusion

King Ina Academy (Infants) is, and will continue to be, an inclusive school, welcoming children from all backgrounds and of all faiths or none. This is the aspiration for all Church of England schools in the country. As such, Church of England schools are not 'faith schools'.

Ethos

It was noted in the SIAS report that the Junior School, 'through its distinctive Christian character, is outstanding at meeting the needs of all learners and that the Headteacher's outstanding vision has the children at its heart and fully reflects the school's Christian values. It demonstrates and inspires both appreciation of life and love of learning and is fully endorsed by the governors'. As the headteacher and board of directors are now leading both schools the positive Christian ethos is already shared across the infant school, having a significant impact. A change to religious designation status will help to ensure this ethos prevails into the future.

Admissions

As an academy the school is responsible for admissions. There would be no change.

Buildings

The buildings and land are currently owned by Somerset County Council. Upon change of designation ownership would be transferred to the Diocesan Board of Finance. In the event of disposal the land would return to its original ownership, Somerset County Council.

Finance

The school will receive the same income for education from the Education Funding Agency based on the number and characteristics of the children as it did before.

The New National Curriculum

All the requirements of the National Curriculum still apply in Church of England designated schools; therefore there will be no changes in the general curriculum of the school. We shall continue to work to the same high standards that we have now.

In Conclusion

The Board of Directors believe that a change to Church of England designation status would enable King Ina C of E Academy continuity of its current Christian ethos and close relationships with the local Church now and in the future.
