When calling for a healthcare appointment, remember that you don't always need to see a doctor and that there are other medical practitioners who may be more appropriate. We operate a standard 10-minute slot for patients' appointments, so be prepared - list your symptoms, jot down questions and let reception know if you need support in any way. There are other ways to get medical help: talk to a pharmacist, call NHS 111, visit a community minor injury unit, or in an emergency call 999 or visit hospital .
