CHURCHES IN SOMERTON PLAN TO JOIN

At meetings held on May 7th the Church Council of Somerton Methodist Church and the Church Meeting of the Somerton United Reformed Church, both in West Street, adopted the following resolution:

'This meeting agrees to proceed towards full union between Somerton Methodist Church and Somerton United Reformed Church in the Methodist Church Building but under a new name.'

This is a further step along a journey that has been developing over the past year or so. The two congregations have been meeting together on a regular basis in each other's premises for joint services. A meeting between the two Churches last June agreed to set up a working group to study the specific details and consequences of various forms of union and advise their respective decision-making bodies. This group has been meeting regularly since October and circulating notes on their discussions to both Churches. Another joint meeting of members and adherents held last month agreed to ask the Church Council and Church Meeting to vote on the above resolution at the earliest opportunity. The vision for the future of the joined congregation is to be a church which is friendly, caring, inviting and nurturing, not only for its members but also for the local community and beyond; underpinning everything we do with worship and prayer.
