



#### **CAN YOU HELP?**

I have been looking at the family records of the men whose names are recorded on a list in the Parish Rooms and I can find very little information about some of them.

G Budd (probably George) is listed as serving in WW1, but the census and other records show only a William Budd whose young son William died in 1932. He was related to the Bennetts. In 1911 Reginald Burt was 13 and worked as an errand boy. He lived with his widowed mother in one of the tiny cottages at Leavers Court. I have found no record of him after 1918. Do you know what happened to him?

In May 1918, Frances Jessie Butler was christened and her sister Louisa in 1921. Their father, Frank William Butler, served in the Army Service Corps as a driver of motor transport. In 1968 his widow Florence was living in Northfield. Does anyone know what happened to Frank? Do you have a story to tell about a relation from anywhere in the world who served in the First World War? The stories are being collected in folders in the Library and will be included in a web site.
